Mother's Day

Mother's Day is a holiday honoring motherhood that is observed in different forms throughout the world. The American incarnation of Mother's Day was created by Anna Jarvis in 1908 and became an official U.S. holiday in 1914. Jarvis would later denounce the holiday's commercialization and spent the latter part of her life trying to remove it from the calendar Celebrations of mothers and motherhood can be traced back to the ancient Greeks and Romans, who held festivals in honor of the mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele, but the clearest modern precedent for Mother's Day is the early Christian festival known as "Mothering Sunday."

Once a major tradition in the United Kingdom and parts of Europe, this celebration fell on the fourth Sunday in Lent and was originally seen as a time when the faithful would return to their "mother church"—the main

church in the vicinity of their home—for a special service.

Over time the Mothering Sunday tradition shifted into a more secular holiday, and children would present their mothers with flowers and other tokens of appreciation. This custom eventually faded in popularity before merging with the American Mother's Day in the 1930s and 1940s.

Fun fact:

Did you know? More phone calls are made on Mother's Day than any other day of the year. These holiday chats with Mom often cause phone traffic to spike by as much as 37 percent.

Protecting Yourself from Browser-Locking Phishing Scams

In today's technology world, we're seeing a very high number of spam and phishing attacks that are very sophisticated. One common type of this attack is a browser-locking scam.

Imagine this: you're browsing the internet, regular news sites, or other pages that you've been visiting before and all of the sudden, your screen freezes. A message pops up, loud siren, or similar noises, warning that your computer is at risk or has been compromised and it urges you to call a provided number for help.

It's a very scary experience. Most import at that time, is to stay calm and know that this is a classic and false scam technique. They didn't "hack" you.

Here's what you should do: DO NOT CALL THE NUMBER. These scams are designed to scare you into paying for unnecessary services or giving someone remote access to your computer. Instead, simply shut down your browser or restart your computer.

On a Windows PC, you can do this by opening Task Manager, Press Ctrl+Shift+Esc. Once in Task Manager, find your Web Browser Application, such as Microsoft Edge, Google Chrome, or Firefox.

On a Mac, press Cmd+Option+Esc to bring up the Force Quit menu. Find your Browser Application and Force Close.

After you restart your browser or your computer, stay clear of the website where you encountered the issue. At lease for a short period of time. For good measure, it's a smart idea to run an antivirus scan to check if anything harmful was downloaded. Staying alert, calm, keeping your software updated, and investing in a Next Generation Antivirus, are your best defenses against these frustrating and false attacks.
